STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Eighteen of Chapter Thirty-four of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Apportionment of State Aid to Agricultural Societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. Section eighteen of chapter thirty-four of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of
3 said section and substituting in place thereof, the following: *'Aid to Agricultural Societies; Apportionment.* There
2 shall be appropriated annually from the state treasury a
3 sum of money, not to exceed three and three-quarters cents
4 per inhabitant of the state, which shall be known as the
5 state stipend for aid and encouragement to agricultural

6 societies and hereafter in this act designated as the stipend.

7 This stipend shall be divided among the legally incorporated 8 agricultural clubs, societies and fair associations of the state, 9 hereafter in this act designated as societies, according to 10 the following schedule and method, two thousand five hun-11 dred dollars, each, annually, to the Maine State Agricultural 12 society, Lewiston, the Eastern Maine State Fair, Bangor, 13 the Central Maine Fair Association, Waterville, the North-14 ern Maine Fair, Presque Isle, and two thousand dollars, 15 annually, to the Maine Pomological Society. The balance 16 of said stipend shall be divided among the legally incorpo-17 rated societies, not heretofore provided for, according to 18 the amount of premiums and gratuities actually paid in 19 full and in cash or valuable equivalent by said societies 20 upon livestock and agricultural and domestic products but 21 no such society, whether specifically mentioned in this act 22 or otherwise, shall be entitled to any share of the stipend 23 unless it shall have complied with the following require-24 ments which shall be considered by the commissioner of 25 agriculture, hereinafter known as the commissioner, as the 26 basis upon which his apportionment of the stipend shall be 27 made, as provided in section seven of this chapter. Each 28 society claiming a share of the state stipend under this act 29 shall file with the commissioner not later than December 30 thirty-first of the year for which said stipend is requested, 31 a statement made under oath, by its treasurer setting forth 32 the financial condition and transactions of the society, the 33 amounts paid in premiums in the several classes of displays

34 herein provided for and such additional information relative 35 to the character of displays and the conduct of exhibitions 36 as the commissioner may request and upon blanks to be 37 furnished by him. No premiums or gratuities shall be 38 considered by the said commissioner in apportioning the 39 amount of stipend to which any society is entitled except 40 those offered and paid upon livestock, vegetables, grain, 41 fruit, flowers, livestock products, home canned foods, grange 42 exhibits, Boys' and Girls' Club exhibits, domestic and fancy 43 articles produced in the farm home, and pulling contests 44 by horses and oxen, and in no case shall the amount allowed 45 on account of premiums paid in said class of domestic and 46 fancy articles, exceed the total amount allowed as premiums 47 upon vegetables, grain, fruits and flowers. No society shall 48 receive from the state a sum greater than that actually 49 raised and paid by the society as premiums and gratuities 50 in the classes herein provided, and in no case shall any 51 society be entitled to any share of the stipend unless it 52 shall have raised and paid in premiums in the classes here-53 tofore set forth, at least two hundred dollars. No society 54 shall receive any portion of such stipend unless it shall have 55 regularly entered and displayed in an attractive manner upon 56 its exhibition grounds not less than one hundred separate 57 and distinct exhibits or entries of vegetables, fruits or dairy 58 products of a quality acceptable to the commissioner or his 59 regularly authorized agent and of varieties known to be 60 common or standard to the county in which such exhibition

61 is held. The stipend may, however, be paid to such agri-62 cultural society or societies as may display a lesser number 63 of exhibits of vegetables, fruits, or dairy products, than as 64 hereinbefore required, provided the commissioner shall cer-65 tify that in his opinion such society or societies have been 66 unable for good and sufficient reasons to secure such re-67 quired number of exhibits. No society shall be entitled to 68 any share of the stipend unless it shall require all cattle 69 exhibited or allowed upon its grounds at exhibition time, to 70 be tuberculin tested within one year previous to the date of 71 its exhibition and declared free from tuberculosis by a 72 veterinarian approved by the commissioner and all live-73 stock exhibited for premiums upon which the claim of any 74 society to a share of the stipend may be based, shall be 75 retained upon the grounds of the society until the hour of 76 noon on the last day of the fair or exhibit. Each and all 77 societies receiving aid from the state under this act shall 78 cause the prohibitory liquor law to be enforced on all 79 grounds over which they have control and not allow im-80 moral shows, gambling in any form or games of chance 81 on said grounds. Neglect or failure on the part of any 82 society to observe any of the foregoing requirements shall 83 be deemed sufficient cause for withholding such society's 84 share of the stipend and the commissioner is required and 85 directed to authorize payment of stipend only to such 86 societies as have observed all of the said requirements."

Sect. 2. Chapter two hundred and five, resolves of nine-

2 teen hundred and eleven, chapter one hundred and seventy3 one, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, chapter
4 ninety, resolves of nineteen hundred and twenty, and all
5 other acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby
6 repealed.
