## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in the Silver Lakes, So-called, in Manchester, Sidney and Belgrade, in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time on or through
3 the ice in Tyler Lake, Lily Lake, Spring Lake, Lower Sil4 ver Lake, Upper Silver Lake, Fairbanks Lake, Gilman
5 Lake, Bean Lake, Doctors' Lake, Sidney Lake, Carl Lake,
6 Joe's Lake, Chamberlain Lake, Wilman Lake, Penney Lake,
7 or Clark's Lake, said lakes being the chain of lakes known
8 as the Silver Lakes, so-called, situate wholly or partly in
9 the towns of Manchester, Sidney and Belgrade, in the coun10 ty of Kennebec.

Sect. 2. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have 2 in possession at any time any kind of fish taken on or 3 through the ice in either of said lakes.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more 3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and one dol-4 lar additional for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in 5 possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 4. Trial justices, police and municipal courts, within 2 their respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original 3 and concurrent, jurisdiction with the supreme judicial court 4 and superior courts in all prosecutions of this act.
