STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT in Favor of Hancock, in the County of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

All that part of Hancock in the county of Hancock, which
2 is described and bounded as follows:

Beginning on the north side of the road leading from La-
2 moine to Ellsworth in the dividing line between the towns
3 of Lamoine and Hancock, at Mitchell's bridge, so-called;
4 thence running easterly in a straight line to the center of
5 Skillings river, so-called; thence running southerly by the
6 center of said river to Frenchman's bay, so-called; thence
7 running westerly in said bay to the present east line of La-
8 moine; thence northerly by said east line of a point where
9 such line intersects the center of said river; thence along
10 the center of said river to the present dividing line between

11 the town of Lamoine and Hancock; thence running wester-
12 ly along said dividing line to the east line of the city of
13 Ellsworth; thence northerly by the dividing line between
14 Ellsworth and Hancock to the point of beginning, together
15 with the inhabitants thereof, are hereby set off from said
16 town of Hancock and annexed to said town of Lamoine and
17 said inhabitants shall enjoy the same rights and be subject
18 to the same requisitions as the town of Lamoine.

All that part of Lamoine, situated east of the center line
2 of Skillings river, so-called, including that portion of land
3 formerly owned by S. Merchant, together with the inhab-
4 itants thereof, are hereby set off from said town of Lamoine
5 and annexed to said town of Hancock and said inhabitants
6 shall enjoy the same rights and be subject to the same
7 requisitions as the town of Hancock.
