STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Repeal Acts Incorporating the Town of Concord.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All acts heretofore enacted for the incorpora-2 tion of the town of Concord, in the county of Somerset, are 3 hereby repealed; provided, that the corporate existence, 4 powers, duties and liabilities of said town shall survive for 5 the purpose of prosecuting and defending all actions and 6 causes of action to which such town is a party, and collect-7 ing payment of all claims and demands now existing in 8 favor of or against said town, and all needful processes 9 growing out of the same.

Sect. 2. In case a plantation is organized within the terri-

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2 tory and embracing the limits of such town of Concord, 3 such plantation may, at a meeting legally called by a war-4 rant and containing an article for that purpose, by vote, as-5 sume all the outstanding liabilities of such town on the day 6 when this act takes effect, and in case such plantation so 7 votes, they shall have authority to raise money by loan upon 8 plantation orders or notes, which shall be valid claims upon 9 such plantation, with which to discharge such liabilities, and 10 thereupon all the property and assets of such town shall 11 become the property of and vested in such plantation.
