STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Provide for the Inspection of Internal Combustion
Engine Fuel Shipments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter two hundred and twenty-four of the public laws
2 of nineteen hundred and twenty-three is hereby amended
3 by adding thereto the following section:

'Sect. 11. Any person, corporation or common carrier
2 who imports, or carries internal combustion engine fuel,
3 which is to be sold within the state, at the first point of
4 entry in Maine where they deliver or discharge any part of
5 such fuel, before making discharge or delivery of any por-
6 tion thereof, shall notify the state auditor of the approxi-

7 mate quantity of the cargo, freight or load, its point of ori-
8 gin, its destination and the names of the consignors and
9 consignees; the state auditor shall promptly inspect and
10 measure or cause to be inspected and measured such cargo,
11 freight or load; the state auditor may, in his discretion, in
12 lieu of such inspection, permit such person or carrier to
13 file with him a statement upon blanks furnished by the state
14 auditor, giving the names of the consignors, the names of
15 the consignees, the point of origin, the amount of fuel, its
16 destination and such other information pertinent thereto as
17 may be thereon required; such statement shall be so filed
18 on or before the fifteenth day of the month next succeeding
19 the calendar month of arrival within the state. All expenses
20 of assessment, inspection, investigation or collection of taxes
21 under this chapter shall be paid from moneys derived from
22 taxes received.'
