STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Clams in Cutler.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person not a 2 resident of the town of Cutler, in the county of Washington, 3 to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of 4 said town.

- Sect. 2. Persons not residents of the town of Cutler may
- 2 be permitted to dig for clams for fish bait or home con-
- 3 sumption within the limits of said town; provided, however,
- 4 that no person shall dig for purposes mentioned in this
- 5 section during any one day more than one bushel of clams.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates the provisions of sections one

- 2 and two of this act shall for each offense be punished by a
- 3 fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment
- 4 for not more than thirty days.
