STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Daniel Jewett.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to
2 be paid to Mrs. Daniel Jewett, of Skowhegan, in the county
3 of Somerset, for the board of Alfred Smith, the sum of
4 two hundred eighty-five dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Alfred Smith, the son of Fred Smith, lived in Long Pond Plantation, from nineteen hundred thirteen to nineteen hundred twenty-three or thereabouts. The child was placed in the custody by Miss Wadsworth and a deputy sheriff from Jackman on the twentieth day of July, with the understanding that the sum of fifteen dollars per month be paid Mrs. Jewett. For nineteen months thereafter, Mrs. Jewett received no pay. At that time, and since then, the State has been paying her for the child's board, the sum of fifteen dollars per month.

No funds being available, from the State, to pay this claim, this resolve is presented.
