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## STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

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AN ACT Relating to Obtaining Permission to Set Traps on  
Trawls.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-five of chapter forty-five of the revised  
2 statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end of said  
3 section the following: 'Whoever violates the provisions of  
4 this section shall pay a fine of not more than twenty-five  
5 dollars and costs,' so that said section, as amended, shall  
6 read as follows:

'Sect. 25. When pots on traps are set on trawls, when  
2 conditions make it impossible to set otherwise, buoys plainly  
3 marked, as provided in the laws of this state, governing  
4 the lobster industry, shall be set at both ends of the trawls;

5 but permission for setting such trawls must be obtained  
6 from the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries, and so  
7 stated on the licenses issued under section eighteen. Who-  
8 ever violates the provisions of this section shall pay a fine  
9 of not more than twenty-five dollars and costs.'
