STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in Bowler Pond in Palermo in
the County of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Bowler
3 Pond, so-called, which pond is situated in the town of
4 Palermo, in the county of Waldo, except in the ordinary
5 manner of casting with unbaited, artificial flies, or fly fishing,
6 so-called.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch
2 and kill more than six fish in all in said Bowler Pond in any
3 one day. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have

4 in possession in any one day more than six fish in all taken
5 in said pond.

Sect. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in
2 possession at any time any kind of fish taken in said Bowler
3 Pond except in the ordinary manner of casting with un-
4 baited, artificial flies, or fly fishing, so-called.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 pay a fine of not less than ten, nor more than thirty dollars,
3 and costs of prosecution, for each offense; and in addition
4 thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had
5 in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 5. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial
2 justices, police and municipal courts within their counties
3 shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-
4 diction with the supreme judicial court, and superior courts.
