## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Sixty-four of Chapter Two Hundred Eleven of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one, Regulating Speed at Intersecting Ways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section sixty-four of chapter two hundred eleven of the
2 public laws of nincteen hundred twenty-one is hereby amend3 ed by striking out the word "eight" in the seventh line of
4 said section and substituting therefor the word 'fifteen,' so
5 that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 64. No person operating a motor vehicle on any 2 way shall drive at any speed greater than is reasonable, 3 safe and proper, having regard to the traffic and use of 4 the way by others, or so as to endanger life or limb. Rac-

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5 ing and reckless driving on any way is hereby forbidden. 6 It shall be prima facie evidence of a rate of speed greater 7 than is reasonably safe and proper, as aforesaid, if a mo-8 tor vehicle is operated in the built-up or compact portion 9 of any city or town at a rate of speed exceeding fifteen 10 miles per hour where the operator's view of the road traf-11 fic is obstructed either upon approaching an intersecting 12 way or in traversing a crossing or intersection of ways, or 13 in going around a corner or curve. Permits may be grarted 14 by municipal officers after a public hearing thereon to drive 15 automobiles or motor cycles in hill climbing contests during 16 a specified time upon a certain way at any rate of speed.'

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
