STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Regulate the Sale of Ice Cream by Weight.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person, firm or corporation shall within this

- 2 state sell at wholesale any ice cream or product made in
- 3 imitation of ice cream unless said ice cream or said imita-
- 4 tion ice cream is sold by weight.
- Sect. 2. The term ice cream as used in this act shall be
- 2 construed to mean that ice cream is a frozen product made
- 3 from cream and sugar with or without a natural flavoring
- 4 and to contain not less than fourteen percent (14%) of milk
- 5 fat.
- Sect. 3. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate
- 2 any of the provisions of this act or neglect or refuse to com-

3 ply with any of the provisions required herein or in any way

4 violate any of its provisions shall be punished by a fine not

5 exceeding one hundred dollars for the first offense and by

6 a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars for each subsequent

7 offense.
