STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Central Maine Sanatorium for the Construction of a Laundry and Quarters for Male Employees.

EMERGENCY PREAMBLE

Whereas a laundry and quarters for the male employees at the Central Maine Sanatorium can be constructed and equipped to much better advantage to the state if the contracts therefor are let early in the season and the work begun as soon as possible, and whereas money for such construction and equipment cannot be used until the funds provided by this resolve become available, and loss and inconvenience will result if such work is not started early in the season, and whereas in the judgment of the Legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section sixteen of article thirty-one of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore be it

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for 2 the Central Maine Sanatorium the sum of seventeen thou-3 sand dollars for the construction and equipment of a laun-4 dry and quarters for male employees.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Central Maine Sanatorium is not properly equipped to take care of its laundry and does not provide suitable quarters for its male employees. This resolve is for the purpose of providing and equipping a new laundry and providing and equipping separate quarters for its male employees.
