STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians
for the General Care, Maintenance and Education Thereof,
at Pleasant Point at Perry, Maine.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from
2 the state treasury to be expended under the direction of
3 the governor and council by the agent of the Passamaquod-
4 dy tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the
5 year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven
6 to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and
7 for the year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-
8 eight to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine,
9 as follows:

Amounting to eighteen thousand dollars for the year from
2 July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven to June thir-
3 tieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight; and eighteen thou-
4 sand dollars for the year from July first, nineteen hundred
5 and twenty-eight to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and
6 twenty-nine.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of the
2 sub-divisions above named and not required for the purpose
3 may, upon recommendation of the state auditor, be trans-
4 ferred by the governor and council to pay bills against any
5 of the above sub-divisions where bills may have been con-
6 tracted in excess of the amount above set forth.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve provides funds for the support and maintenance of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the fiscal years nineteen hundred and twenty-eight and nineteen hundred and twenty-nine and is similar in character to one presented at previous sessions of the legislature, Pleasant Point, Perry, Maine.
