STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Grace Griffin, of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of six dollars per month be, 2 and hereby is, granted to Grace Griffin, of Lewiston, to be 3 paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and 4 their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nine-5 teen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until other-6 wise provided by the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Grace Griffin is the daughter of James Nelligan, who served in Company B, 12th Regiment of Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. Her health is very poor, and she has no means of procuring a livelihood. Her sister, who died during the past year, received a state pension on account of her father's service.
