#### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Eighteen of Chapter Thirty-four of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Apportionment of State Aid to Agricultural Societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. Section eighteen of chapter thirty-four of the

- 2 revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of said
- 3 section and substituting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 18. Aid to Agricultural Societies; Apportionment.

- 2 There shall be appropriated annually from the state treasury
- 3 a sum of money not to exceed three and one-half cents
- 4 per inhabitant of the state, which shall be known as the
- 5 state stipend for aid and encouragement to agricultural so-

6 cieties and hereafter in this act designated as the stipend. 7 This stipend shall be divided among the legally incorporated 8 agricultural clubs, societies and fair associations of the state, o hereafter in this act designated as societies, according to 10 the following schedule and method. Two thousand dollars II shall be paid annually to the Maine Pomological Society 12 and the balance of said stipend shall be divided pro rata 13 among the legally incorporated societies, not heretofore pro-14 vided for according to the amount of premiums and gratui-15 ties actually paid in full and in cash or valuable equivalent 16 by said societies upon livestock and agricultural and domes-17 tic products but no such society whether specifically men-18 tioned in this act or otherwise shall be entitled to any share 19 of the stipend unless it shall have complied with the follow-20 ing requirements, which shall be considered by the com-21 missioner of agriculture hereinafter known as the com-22 missioner, as the basis upon which his apportionment of 23 the stipend shall be made as provided in section seven of 24 this chapter. Each society claiming a share of the state 25 stipend under this act shall file with the commissioner not 26 later than December thirty-first of the year for which said 27 stipend is requested, a statement made under oath, by its 28 treasurer setting forth the financial condition and trans-29 actions of the society, the amounts paid in premiums in the 30 several classes or displays herein provided for and such 31 additional information relative to the character of displays 32 and the conduct of exhibitions as the commissioner may

33 request and upon blanks to be furnished by him. No prem-34 iums or gratuities shall be considered by the said commis-35 sioner in apportioning the amount of stipend to which any 36 society is entitled except those offered and paid upon live-37 stock, poultry, vegetables, grain, fruit, flowers, livestock 38 products, home canned foods, grange exhibits, farm exhibits. 39 Boys' and Girls' Club exhibits, domestic and fancy articles 40 produced in the farm home, and pulling contests by horses 41 and oxen, and in no case shall the amount allowed on ac-42 count of premiums paid in said class of domestic and fancy 43 articles exceed the total amount allowed as premiums upon 44 vegetables, grain, fruits and flowers. No society, the Maine 45 Pomological Society excepted, shall receive from the state 46 a sum greater than that actually raised and paid by the so-47 ciety as premiums and gratuities in the classes, herein pro-48 vided, and in no case shall any society be entitled to any 49 share of the stipend unless it shall have raised and paid in 50 premiums in the classes heretofore set forth at least four 51 hundred dollars. No society shall receive any portion of the 52 stipend in excess of twenty-five hundred dollars. No society 53 shall receive any portion of such stipend unless it shall have 54 regularly entered and displayed in an attractive manner upon 55 its exhibition grounds not less than one hundred separate 56 and distinct exhibits or entries of vegetables, fruits or dairy 57 products of a quality acceptable to the commissioner or his 58 regularly authorized agent and of varieties known to be 59 common or standard to the county in which such exhibition

60 is held. The stipend may, however, be paid to such agri-61 cultural society or societies as may display a lesser number 62 of exhibits of vegetables, fruits, or dairy products, than as 63 hereinbefore required, provided the commissioner shall cer-64 tify that in his opinion such society or societies have been 65 unable for good and sufficient reasons to secure such re-66 quired number of exhibits. No society shall be entitled to 67 any share of the stipend unless it shall require all cattle ex-68 hibited or allowed upon its grounds at exhibition time to be 60 tuberculin tested within one year previous to the date of its 70 exhibition and declared free from tuberculosis by a veterin-71 arian approved by the commissioner. Each and all societies 72 receiving aid from the state under this act shall cause the 73 prohibitory liquor law to be enforced on all grounds over 74 which they have control and not allow immoral shows, gamb-75 ling in any form or games of chance on said grounds. Neg-76 lect or failure on the part of any society to observe any of 77 the foregoing requirements shall be deemed sufficient cause 78 for withholding such society's share of the stipend and the 79 commissioner is required and directed to authorize payment 80 of stipend only to such societies as have observed all of the 81 said requirements.'

Sect. 2. Chapter two hundred and five, resolves of nine-2 teen hundred and eleven, chapter one hundred and seventy-3 one, resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, chapter 4 ninety, resolves of nineteen hundred and twenty, and all 5 other acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby 6 repealed.
