STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Wells, in the
County of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person not an inhabitant of the state of Maine, or not a temporary resident of the town of Wells, in the county of York, to dig clams within said town of Wells; such inhabitants of the state of Maine and temporary residents of the town of Wells shall dig not more than one-half bushel in any one day for home consumption, within this state.

Sect. 2. No person, not an inhabitant of said town of

2 Wells shall dig clams for commercial purposes within said
3 town.

Sect. 3. No clams shall be dug within the limits of said
2 town of Wells other than with a clam hoe.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates the provisions of this act, for
2 each offense, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding
3 twenty-five dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty
4 days.
