STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE Appropriating Money for the Compilation and Publication of Data Concerning the Resources of the State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the 2 sum of fifty thousand dollars for the fiscal year from July 3 one, nineteen hundred twenty-seven, to June thirty, nineteen 4 hundred twenty-eight, and the sum of fifty thousand dollars 5 for the fiscal year from July one, nineteen hundred twenty-6 eight to June thirty, nineteen hundred twenty-nine, for the 7 purpose of compiling and publishing data regarding the 8 agricultural, industrial and recreational resources of the 9 state of Maine for general distribution to all persons inter-to ested in the state of Maine.

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This legislative fund shall be used for the following pur-2 poses :

a. Compilation, publication, dissemination and advertising2 of data relative to the state, and the general administration3 of the purposes of this act.

b. For newspaper and magazine advertising in conjunc-2 tion with the monies raised by cities and towns.

Funds to be solicited from cities and towns for newspaper 2 and magazine advertising, names of contributing cities and 3 towns to be mentioned in advertising and included in spec-4 ial service pamphlet of contributing towns.

Said funds to be paid into the state treasury and expended 2 by a commission known as the Maine Development Com-3 mission, under the direction of the governor and council, 4 which said commission shall be composed of the commis-5 sioner of agriculture, commissioner of inland fisheries and 6 game, commissioner of forestry, secretary of state and labor 7 commissioner, with six citizens, representing varied interests 8 of the state of Maine, to be appointed by the governor and 9 council. The first citizen appointees of said commission 10 shall be appointed as follows: two for one year, two for 11 two years and two for three years.

No member of this commission shall receive any compen-2 sation for services.

Private contributions may be received from time to time 2 for the purposes herein set forth, and shall be paid into the 3 state treasury and administered in the same manner as funds 4 appropriated by the legislature and those contributed by the 5 cities and towns, or in such manner within the purposes of 6 this act as the donor may provide.

All contracts to be approved by the governor and council.

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
