STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE Appropriating Money for the Compilation and
Publication of Data Concerning the Resources of the State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the
2 sum of fifty thousand dollars for the fiscal year from July
3 one, nineteen hundred twenty-seven, to June thirty, nineteen
4 hundred twenty-eight, and the sum of fifty thousand dollars
5 for the fiscal year from July one, nineteen hundred twenty-
6 eight to June thirty, nineteen hundred twenty-nine, for the
7 purpose of compiling and publishing data regarding the
8 agricultural, industrial and recreational resources of the
9 state of Maine for general distribution to all persons inter-
10 ested in the state of Maine.

This legislative fund shall be used for the following purposes :

a. Compilation, publication, dissemination and advertising of data relative to the state, and the general administration of the purposes of this act.

b. For newspaper and magazine advertising in conjunction with the monies raised by cities and towns.

Funds to be solicited from cities and towns for newspaper and magazine advertising, names of contributing cities and towns to be mentioned in advertising and included in special service pamphlet of contributing towns.

Said funds to be paid into the state treasury and expended by a commission known as the Maine Development Commission, under the direction of the governor and council, which said commission shall be composed of the commissioner of agriculture, commissioner of inland fisheries and game, commissioner of forestry, secretary of state and labor commissioner, with six citizens, representing varied interests of the state of Maine, to be appointed by the governor and council. The first citizen appointees of said commission shall be appointed as follows: two for one year, two for two years and two for three years.

No member of this commission shall receive any compensation for services.

Private contributions may be received from time to time for the purposes herein set forth, and shall be paid into the state treasury and administered in the same manner as funds

4 appropriated by the legislature and those contributed by the
5 cities and towns, or in such manner within the purposes of
6 this act as the donor may provide.

All contracts to be approved by the governor and council.
