STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

ORDER Relative to Workmen's Compensation Insurance.

ORDERED, the House concurring, that a committee com2 posed of the insurance commissioner, Wilbur D. Spencer,
3 two senators appointed by the president of the senate, three
4 members of the house of representatives appointed by the
5 speaker of the house, representing employees and employers
6 subject to the workmen's compensation act and the insurance
7 carriers doing business in the state of Maine, is hereby au8 thorized and directed to make full investigation of all evi9 dence and phases of the operation, during the last eleven
10 years, of the workmen's compensation law of this state, and
11 all elements and phases of the cost of workmen's compen12 sation insurance in this state; and make full report in writ-

13 ing to the governor on or before October one, nineteen 14 hundred and twenty-eight.

Such committee is hereby given full power to summon 2 witnesses and require the production of papers and cocu-3 ments and records, such witnesses to receive the same at-4 tendance fees as obtained in the supreme judicial court.

Such committee is to serve without pay other than actual 2 expenses and is authorized to employ at the expense of the 3 state all necessary expert or other assistance.

Said committee before it makes any engagements or incurs 2 any expense shall formulate its general plan, obtain esti-3 mates of the expense of the investigation proposed, submit 4 its said plan with said estimates to the governor and council, 5 and if that body approves said committee shall be authorized 6 to make its investigation along the line it has proposed and 7 to the extent so far as expense is concerned as has been 8 approved by the governor and council.
