STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Mabel Arm-
strong, of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Mabel Armstrong, of Lewiston,
3 to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until
6 otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mabel Armstrong is the daughter of William R. Garcelon, who served as a private in Company A, 29th Regiment of Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. She has a family of children dependent upon her, and no way of supporting them properly.

I made investigation of this case and from what I can find out I am satisfied that Mrs. Mabel Armstrong is very deserving; that she is the daughter of Wm. R. Garcelon, who served in the Civil War; that she is a woman of good character, without means, and is in need of the state pension mentioned in the above resolve.
