STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Bertha J.
Hodson of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Bertha J. Hodson, of Lewiston,
3 to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until
6 otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Bertha J. Hodson is the widow of William E. Hodson, who served as a private in Company A, 1st Division Bn., 151st Depot Brigade, during the World War.

She has one child, eleven years old, and an aged and sick and invalid mother, of whom she is the sole support. She is now receiving her husband's bonus money from the Federal Government, at the rate of twelve dollars and sixty cents quarterly, but these payments cease in April, next. Her mother requires constant attention and it is, therefore, difficult for her to work out. She has no relatives who help her.
