STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Nellie Buck of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be, 2 and hereby is, granted to Nellie Buck, of Lewiston, to be 3 paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and 4 their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nine-5 teen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until other-6 wise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Nellie Buck is the daughter of James Buck, who served as a private in Company H, 32nd Regiment of Maine Infantry, during the Civil War.

Miss Buck is a very old lady, not able to work, living with her niece, and dependent upon her; this niece has several children, and is a very poor woman. The aid asked for her aunt is worthy, and I hope will be granted. Miss Buck does not receive any aid from the city.
