STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Prohibit the Use of More than Two Lines for Trolling at Any Time in One Boat or Other Vessel or Conveyance in the Rangeley Chain of Lakes, So-called, Situated Partly in the County of Franklin and Partly in the County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the occupants of any
2 one boat, motor boat, canoe, raft or other vessel or convey3 ance to troll with more than two lines at any time in Range4 ley lake, Kennebago lake, Cupsuptic lake, Mooselucmeguntic
5 lake, or Upper or Lower Richardson lakes, said lakes being
6 the Rangeley chain of lakes, so-called, and situated partly

- 7 in the county of Franklin and partly in the county of Ox-8 ford.
- Sec. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more 3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense.
- Sec. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial jus-2 tices and police and municipal courts within their counties 3 shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-4 diction with the supreme judicial court and superior courts.
