IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the County of Somerset, for Reimbursement for Expenses Incurred in the Sickness and Death of John Stewart.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be paid the county of Somerset, for reimbursement of expenses incurred in the sickness and death of John Stewart, the sum of two hundred twenty dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

John Stewart was sentenced to jail in Skowhegan for a term of ninety days. During the period he was taken ill and was removed to Kennebec Valley Hospital. An operation was performed upon him. He later died and the county has paid the expenses attendant upon both his sickness and death.
