STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Prohibit Plug Fishing for Square Tailed Trout and Land-locked Salmon in Great Pond, of the Belgrade Chain of Lakes, which Lake is Situated in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any square tailed trout or landlocked salmon at any time in Great Pond, so-called, of the Belgrade chain of lakes, which lake is situated in the county of Kennebec, by still or plug fishing, so-called.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in pos-

2 session at any time any square tailed trout or landlocked
3 salmon taken by still or plug fishing in said Great Pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more
3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and one dollar
4 additional for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in pos-
5 session in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial
2 justices, police and municipal courts within their respective
3 jurisdiction shall have, upon complaint, original and con-
4 current jurisdiction with the supreme judicial court and
5 superior courts.
