STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Fourteen of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Indian Tribes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Chapter fourteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended,2 by adding thereto a section to be numbered section fifty-five3 to read as follows:

'Sect. 55. On the first Tuesday of November, nineteen 2 hundred and twenty-eight, and biennially thereafter, the 3 Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians shall hold their election 4 for the choice of governors and lieutenant governors of said 5 tribe, and a representative to the legislature of this state. 6 The agents of said tribe shall give notice of the time and 7 place, seven days before said day of election, by posting 8 notices thereof, one at their respective offices and one in 9 some conspicuous place on the reservations at Pleasant 10 point and Peter Dana's Point. Said agents shall receive, 11 sort and count the votes given in at said election, in the 12 presence of members of the tribe, and those elected shall 13 be given certificates therefor.'
