**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN**

**RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Ivanilla Nute,
of Lewiston.**

Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Ivanilla Nute, of Lewiston, to
3 be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers
4 and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first,
5 nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until
6 otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ivanilla Nute is the daughter of Isaac N. Marsh, who served as a private in Company E, 21st Regiment of Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. She has a mother dependent upon her.

The above mentioned Ivanilla Nute is well known to me and in my judgment entirely worthy of this state aid. Because of the age and infirmity of her mother she is deprived of the opportunity of seeking or following work, and is suffering severely thereby. So far as my knowledge goes she is a woman of good character, and the facts stated above as to her father are strictly correct.
