RESOLVE, for Screening Certain Lakes and Ponds in the
State.

Resolved: That the sum of six thousand one hundred and
2 twenty-five dollars, be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be
3 taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the
4 department of inland fisheries and game, to be expended
5 by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, to aid
6 in screening the following named lakes and ponds. Provid-
7 ed, however, that no appropriation hereafter specified for the
8 erection of a screen at the outlet of a lake or pond shall be
9 available until some responsible corporation, or incorporat-
10 ed fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of

11 the lake or pond to be screened is situated, or some other
 12 town in the county in which said waters are situated, shall
 13 have, in legal towns meeting, and having an article in the
 14 warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote
 15 of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of
 16 said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all
 17 debris, so that the same will not become clogged and pre-
 18 vent the free running of water through the same, and pro-
 19 vided, further, that said appropriation shall not be avail-
 20 able until the citizens of the county in which said lake or
 21 pond to be screened is situated, shall have paid into the
 22 state treasury the balance necessary, as found by the com-
 23 missioner of inland fisheries and game, to erect said screen;
 24 and provided, further, if the actual cost of any screen pro-
 25 vided for in this resolve is less than the amount appropri-
 26 ated therefor, the state shall be liable for only one-half of
 27 the cost of such screen. Any appropriation hereinafter
 28 named, or part thereof, not expended during the year nine-
 29 teen hundred and twenty-seven shall be available during the
 30 year nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

To aid in screening Biscay Pond, in the county of Lincoln, three hundred dollars	300.00
To aid in screening Sabattus Pond in Androscoggin county, two hundred and fifty dollars	250.00
For screening Mattamiscontis Lake, in Township Two, Range Eight, Penobscot county, one hundred dollars	100.00
To aid in screening Echo Lake, in the town of Fayette, county of Kennebec, five hundred dollars	500.00
For screening Wilson Lake, in the town of Wilton, five hundred dollars	500.00
