IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Clams in Trenton.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the Town of Trenton, in the County of Hancock, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town.

Sect. 2. Any person temporarily residing therein or the riparian owners of any clam flats may take therefrom for the immediate use of himself or his family not exceeding one bushel of clams in one day.

Sect. 3. Any person taking clams contrary to the provi-

2 sions of this act shall be punished for each offense by a fine
3 not exceeding twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment not
4 exceeding thirty days, or by both.
