#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Continue the Game Sanctuary in Knox County Known as the Knox County Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. For a period of four years from July II, 1929
2 no person shall, at any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill
3 any wild animal or any game or wild bird within the fol4 lowing described territory, situated in the city of Rockland
5 and towns of Thomaston, Warren and Rockport, in the
6 county of Knox, known as the Burnt Land or Bog, which
7 territory is bounded and described as follows: Beginning
8 at Willis Corner, so-called, on the Beechwood's road; thence

9 westerly by the Warren Highland road to the Oyster River 10 bridge; thence north following the course of the Oyster 11 river to the Warren, West Rockport road; thence by said 12 road and the Beechwood's road, easterly and southerly to 13 Willis Corner at the point of beginning, containing approx-14 imately six thousand five hundred acres. It shall also be 15 unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time 16 any wild animal or any game or wild bird or part thereof 17 taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 2. Penalties for violation of provisions of act. Who-2 ever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to 3 a penalty of not less than ten nor more than three hundred 4 dollars and costs for each offense, or imprisonment for sixty 5 days, or both said fine and imprisonment.
