# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Harry T. Merrill for Reimbursement for Apple Trees Destroyed by Deer.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to Harry T. Merrill of New Gloucester the sum of 3 two hundred twenty-eight dollars and thirty-five cents to 4 reimburse him for damages to apple trees, root grafts and 5 seedlings in his orchard at New Gloucester caused by deer

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Harry T. Merrill of New Gloucester has a large young apple orchard consisting of 1200-1300 trees and seedlings situated near his home in New Gloucester. From June 1928 to December 1928 deer caused damage to 723 trees and seedlings. The orchard has been examined since the damage was done by reprepresentatives of the department of inland fish and game who have appraised the damages.
