IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Lee for Support of the Family of Oliver T. Lyons, State Paupers.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated 2 to be paid to the town of Lee, the sum of thirty-five dol-3 lars, to reimburse said town for money expended for sup-4 port of the family of Oliver T. Lyons, state paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve is to cover assistance necessarily furnished the family of Oliver T. Lyons by the town of Lee. The selectmen have made every possible effort to find out if this family has a settlement, but are unable to fix the liability. They do not belong in the town of Lee. As the town cannot make definite proof that they have no settlement, it cannot collect from the state in the usual manner, and, therefore, asks for reimbursement by action of the Legislature. The Legislature of 1927 appropriated \$78.60 for support of this family, and the selectmen request that the account covered by this resolve be cared for in the same manner.
