STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE in Favor of Clarence W. Morse, Compensating
Him for the Loss of Poultry.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the
2 sum of two hundred sixty-five dollars and fifty cents to be
3 paid to Clarence W. Morse of Belmont, to compensate him
4 for the loss of poultry killed by foxes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In the spring of nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, Clarence W. Morse started to raise one hundred eighty-four chickens, with sixteen hens and one rooster. During the summer, foxes carried off fourteen hens, one rooster and one hundred sixty-two chickens. They were seen about the premises. In all, one hundred seventy-seven hens and chickens worth one dollar and fifty cents each were taken.
