RESOLVE, in Favor of H. H. Havey and Estate of Bradbury Smith for Reimbursement for Loss on State Highway Contract.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of nineteen thousand six hundred fifty-four and 70-100 3 dollars (\$19,654.70) to be paid to H. H. Havey and estate 4 of Bradbury Smith to reimburse the said H. H. Havey and 5 estate of Bradbury Smith for loss on state highway con-6 struction.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In 1916 Bradbury Smith and H. H. Havey, both of Sullivan, Maine, contracted with the state highway commission to construct a certain section of state highway, known as the Gardiner-Richmond section, located four and one-half miles in the city of Gardiner and one-half mile in the town of Richmond, for the sum of twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000). Construction was commenced in July, 1916, and continued with slight interruption during the winter months, until the job was fully completed in January, 1918. The total costs of construction to the contractors was \$47,654.70, thereby making a loss of \$19,654.70.
