RESOLVE, in Favor of James E. Jackson, Compensating Him for the Loss of Poultry.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to 2 be paid to James E. Jackson of Belmont, to compensate him 3 for poultry killed by foxes, the sum of seventy-five dollars.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In the course of four or five days during the month of June, nineteen hundred twenty-eight, twenty hens and five large chickens were killed by foxes. He was obliged to sell the rest of his poultry, which caused a loss of profit to him.
