STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Combine the Treasurer and Tax Collector of the
City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. The treasurer of the city of Lewiston shall
2 also be the collector for said city with all the powers of col-
3 lectors of taxes under the laws of this state. He shall be
4 styled "treasurer and collector," and shall give but one bond
5 for the faithful performance of his duties; said bond to
6 be approved by the city council; and may appoint assistants
7 and deputies as provided by law. All warrants directed to
8 him by the assessors and municipal officers shall run to him

9 and his successors in office, and shall be in form prescribed
10 by law, changing such parts only as by this act are required
11 to be changed. The method of keeping, vouching and set-
12 tling his accounts, shall be subject to such rules and regu-
13 lations as the city council may establish. Said treasurer and
14 collector shall collect all such uncollected taxes and assess-
15 ments in whatever year assessed, as may be collected during
16 his term of office; and at the expiration of said term, his
17 powers as collector shall wholly cease; all sales, distresses,
18 and other acts and proceedings, lawfully commenced by him
19 as such treasurer and collector, may be as effectually con-
20 tinued and completed by his successor in office as though
21 done by himself; and all unreturned warrants, which would
22 otherwise be returnable to him, shall be returned to his suc-
23 cessor in office.

Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with sec-
2 tion one are hereby repealed.
