STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Eustis for Support of Thomas Serouis and Family, Having No Known Settlement in the State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the town of Eustis, the sum of four hundred 3 forty-nine dollars and eleven cents, to reimburse said town 4 for money expended for support of Thomas Serouis and 5 family, having no known settlement in the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In the Fall of 1927, the children of Thomas Serouis, living in T. No. 4, R. 3, B. K. P., W. K. R., known as Wyman, were very sick and the family was destitute. Dr. George H. Coombs, of the State Department of Health, visited the family and reported that it was necessary that they should have immediate medical treatment, and this was furnished by the town of Eustis, being the nearest incorporated town. It was also necessary to provide other assistance for the family.

In 1928, Mr. Serouis was committed to jail in Franklin County for a violation of the liquor law, and it again became necessary for the town of Eustis to support the family.

The above resolve covers the entire bills in the case. The Selectmen of Eustis have made every possible effort to find a pauper settlement for this family, but have been unable to do so.
