RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Eustis for Support of  
the Family of Albert J. Seavey, Having no Known Settlement in the State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to  
2 be paid to the town of Eustis, the sum of one hundred  
3 seventy-two dollars and eighty-five cents, to reimburse said  
4 town for money expended for support of the family of  
5 Albert J. Seavey, having no known settlement in the state.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

Albert J. Seavey was sent to jail in Franklin County in 1927, leaving his family, consisting of a wife and six children, in distress in the town of Eustis. The town expended \$172.85 for their support.

The Chairman of the Board of Selectmen of Eustis has spent a great deal of time trying to fix the settlement of Mr. Seavey, but has been unable to do so. Mr. Seavey's father died when he was a small child, and he lived with relatives in various places in Maine and New Hampshire until he grew up; he cannot give the length of time in each place. His wife was Cora M. Murray of Bigelow Plantation.
