STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Establish a Game Sanctuary in the Towns of
Mapleton and Chapman in the County of Aroostook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall, at any time, hunt, chase,
2 catch, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal within
3 the limits of the following described tract or territory
4 situated in Aroostook county, to wit: Lot 112, better known
5 as Mile Block in the town of Mapleton, and Lots No. 7, 8,
6 15, 16, and 23, in the northeast corner of the town of Chap-
7 man, said territory being also known as Hobart Hill prop-
8 erty, consisting of approximately twelve or fourteen hun-

9 dred acres. Provided, however, that the cost of designating
10 the above described land as a game sanctuary and the salary
11 and expense of deputy game wardens employed to police
12 and protect such territory shall be paid by the owner of
13 said land thus described, Arthur R. Gould of Presque Isle,
14 county of Aroostook and state of Maine.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in
2 his possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal or
3 part or parts thereof taken in violation of this act.

Sect. 3. Penalty. Whoever violates any provision of this
2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars
3 nor more than three hundred dollars and costs for each
4 offense or imprisonment for sixty days or both said fine and
5 imprisonment.

Sect. 4. Territory may be enlarged. The commissioner
2 of inland fisheries and game is empowered to enlarge the
3 territory of this sanctuary upon the written consent of the
4 owners of the additional land to be included.
