STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Chester Dutch, Compensating Him
for the Loss of a Cow.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the
2 sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to Chester Dutch to
3 compensate him for a cow which was condemned and killed
4 by the state for alleged tuberculosis.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This cow was purchased in New Hampshire and legally transported into Maine. A tuberculin test was made and there was a reaction. She was condemned by the veterinary and taken from Mr. Dutch. Mr. Dutch executed a claim voucher in the sum of one hundred dollars for damages sustained by her loss which are unpaid.
