STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Smyrna for Support of
Ellen Rigby, a Person Having No Known Settlement in the
State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to
2 be paid to the town of Smyrna, the sum of seven hundred
3 ninety-four dollars and sixty-five cents, to reimburse said
4 town for money expended for support of Ellen Rigby, a
5 person having no known settlement in the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve includes the expense for support of Ellen Rigby from March 28, 1927, until December 31, 1928. Mrs. Rigby and her husband lived in Moro Plantation for a long time. Since leaving Moro they have lived in a number of different towns in that section of the state, and the best information procurable is that they have never been in any one place long enough to acquire a settlement since leaving Moro Plantation. Her husband, George H. Rigby, is now living in the town of Mount Chase.
