STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Milo for Support of a
State Pauper.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to
2 be paid to the town of Milo, the sum of two hundred fifty-
3 two dollars and fourteen cents, to reimburse said town for
4 money expended for the support of Millie Wharton, a state
5 pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Millie Wharton is the widow of John E. Wharton, who died in the town of Greenbush several years ago. Said John E. Wharton had no known settlement in the State, and after every possible effort had been made to fix the liability, the claim of the town of Greenbush for expenses incurred for his sickness and burial, were allowed by the legislature.

Mrs. Wharton has no settlement in the town of Milo, and that town cannot collect from any other town.
