STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Manner of Signing Certificates of Shares.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-six of chapter fifty-one of the revised stat-2 utes as amended by chapter forty-nine of the public laws 3 of nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby amended by 4 striking out all of said section beginning with the word 5 "certificates" in the seventh line thereof and substituting 6 in place thereof the following: 'Certificates of shares with 7 the seal of the corporation affixed, shall be issued to those 8 entitled to them by transfer or otherwise, signed by such 9 officer or officers as the by-laws shall prescribe, but where

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10 any such certifiacte is signed by a transfer agent or trans-11 fer clerk and by a registrar, the signatures of any such offi-12 cer or officers and the seal of the corporation upon such 13 certificate may be facsimiles, engraved or printed,' so that 14 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 36. When the capital of a corporation is divided 2 into shares, and certificates thereof are issued, they may 3 be transferred by endorsement and delivery. The delivery 4 of a certificate of stock of a corporation to a bona fide pur-5 chaser or pledgee for value, together with a written trans-6 fer of the same or a written power of attorney to sell, as-7 sign and transfer the same, signed by the owner of the cer-8 tificate, shall be a sufficient delivery to transfer the title o against all parties. Certificates of shares with the seal of to the corporation affixed, shall be issued to those entitled to 11 them by transfer or otherwise, signed by such officer or 12 officers as the by-laws shall prescribe, but where any such 13 certificate is signed by a transfer agent or transfer clerk 14 and by a registrar, the signatures of any such officer or offi-15 cers and the seal of the corporation upon such certificate 16 may be facsimiles, engraved or printed.'
