STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Voters in Unincorporated Places and on
Islands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-four of chapter seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence of said section and inserting in place thereof the following: 'And such electors so presenting their polls and estates may vote in such town for all national, state and county officers and representatives to the legislature,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 74. Electors living on islands adjacent to the mainland along the coast of the state and within the jurisdiction

3 thereof, but not incorporated with any town, and all such
4 electors living in other unorganized places may furnish lists
5 of their polls and estates to the assessors of any adjacent
6 town, on or before the first day of each April, and said
7 assessors shall assess state and county taxes upon all such
8 persons, and they shall be collected in the same manner and
9 by the same officers as if such electors were inhabitants of
10 such town. And such electors so presenting their polls and
11 estates may vote in such town for all national, state and
12 county officers and representatives to the legislature.'
