STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Merrill for Support of Charles Huntley, a Person Having No Known Settlement in the State.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the town of Merrill, the sum of four hundred 3 sixteen dollars, to reimburse said town for money expended 4 for support of Charles Huntley, a person having no known 5 settlement in the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Charles Huntley has been cared for as a pauper in the town of Merrill since January 1, 1927, and will have to be supported as a public charge during the remainder of his life. The selectmen of the town of Merrill believe that he has no pauper settlement in the state. He has lived and worked in many different places and has not had a home for a great many years, if he ever had one.
