STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Benton for Expenses of a Person in Quarantine.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to 2 be paid to the town of Benton, the sum of one hundred ten

- 3 dollars, to reimburse said town for money expended for ex-
- 4 penses of Mrs. George A. Cates while in quarantine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

George A. Cates was a resident of Salem, Mass., for about eighteen years, ending in 1919. He was then at the Soldiers' Home at Togus for two years, and at Waterville and Fairfield, coming to Benton in 1926. The bill covered by this resolve was incurred in September and October, 1926, for services of a nurse and other expenses while the family was quarantined on account of scarlet fever.
