IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

---

AN ACT to Establish a Game Sanctuary in the Town of  
Standish, in the County of Cumberland.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall, except as herein provided, at  
2 any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at or molest any wild animal  
3 or any game or wild bird within the following described  
4 territory situated in the town of Standish, in the county  
5 of Cumberland: Bounded on the southeast by the state road  
6 from Standish Village to Sebago lake; on the northeast by  
7 the state road from Sebago lake to the railroad crossing at  
8 Richville; on the northwest by the M. C. R. R. from Rich-  
9 ville to Steep Falls and on the southeast by the state road

10 from Steep Falls to Standish village.

Sect. 2. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have  
2 in possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal taken  
3 in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. The provisions of this act shall not prohibit any  
2 person residing within the limits of the above described  
3 sanctuary from shooting at or destroying any wild bird or  
4 any wild animal when found destroying his property, nor  
5 shall it be construed to prohibit the trapping of fur-bearing  
6 animals within the above described sanctuary in accordance  
7 with the general laws of the state.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than  
3 three hundred dollars and costs for each offense or im-  
4 prisonment for sixty days, or both said fine and imprison-  
5 ment.
