## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Sangerville, to Reimburse Said Town for Money Paid for Mother's Aid.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the 2 sum of sixty-five dollars and thirty-three cents (\$65.33) to 3 be paid to the town of Sangerville, to reimburse said town 4 for money paid for Mother's Aid, for the family of Harry

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The aforesaid sum of \$65.33 was paid by said town of Sangerville for the months of June, July, August, and until September 8, 1928, to May F. Sabine, former wife of Harry Sabine, State Pauper, as Mother's Aid, for and in behalf of four minor children of said Harry Sabine.

The Town of Oakland, Maine, by Chapter 141, of the Resolves of the 83rd (1927) Legislature of this State, was reimbursed for similar expenditures for said children, upon a Statement of Facts, that said Harry Sabine has never acquired a pauper settlement in this State in his own right, and that said children are subjects of the Mother's Aid law.

And said Town of Sangerville in support of this Resolve adopts and offers said Statement of Facts, and said Resolve, to wit, Chap. 141 of the Resolves of this State of 1927.
