STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Amend Section Twelve of Article Six of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twentythree, Entitled "An Act to Grant a New Charter to the City of Portland," Making Explicit Certain Powers of the Park Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
That section twelve of article six of the private and special
2 laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three be amended by
3 striking out the first "and" in the fourth line of said section
4 twelve and by inserting after the word "Portland" in the
5 fifth line of said section twelve the words, 'and to construct

6 and maintain the streets or public ways known as Baxter 7 Boulevard, Eastern Promenade, Western Promenade and 8 Bates street,' so that said section twelve, as amended, shall 9 read as follows:

'Sect. 12. Tax to be assessed. To enable said commis-2 sion to extend the work of the Back Bay and Fore River 3 commission and to make improvements, to enlarge the park 4 areas, to maintain the public grounds and cemeteries under 5 their charge, to pay for additions to grounds and ceme-6 teries already acquired, or to be acquired by the city of 7 Portland and to construct and maintain the streets or pub-8 lic ways known as Baxter Boulevard, Eastern Promenade, 9 Western Promenade and Bates street, a tax of one mill on 10 the dollar shall be assessed annually by the assessors of said II city of Portland upon all estates and property subject to 12 taxation in said city, to be taken at the last regular valu-13 ation. The amount of said tax, when raised, shall be set 14 aside as a special fund to be expended by said commission 15 for the purposes specified in this charter; provided, how-16 ever, that one per cent of the amount of the above tax, shall 17 be reserved by the city treasurer each year to cover any 18 uncollected portion of this tax and carried to the credit of 19 the account known as overlayings and abatements."
