STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of a Highway Between Long Pond and Greenville.

Resolved: That the sum of one hundred thousand dollars

- 2 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of constructing a
- 3 highway between Long Pond in Somerset county and
- 4 Greenville in Pistacaquis county.

Twenty-five thousand dollars to be expended in nineteen

- 2 hundred thirty on each, the said Long Pond end and on
- 3 the Greenville end and twenty-five thousand dollars to be
- 4 expended in nineteen hundred thirty-one on each, the said
- 5 Long Pond end and on the Greenville end.

The above money is to be expended under the supervision 2 of the state highway commission.

The money is to be taken from funds not otherwise appropriated.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In nineteen hundred and ten a highway was started from Jackman and the intentions was to build a highway eventually to Kineo, some ten miles was built and the towns and plantations in the district was taxed for the construction of this highway, but the war conditions came on and the matter was dropped, the highway now is constructed about one-half mile below Long Pond. In nineteen hundred twenty-seven legislature an appropriation was made for fifty thousand dollars and this money was expended on the Greenville end of the highway.

This highway when eventually constructed will be a great benefit to the eastern part of Maine and will no doubt boom the Moosehead Lake area.
